



# Men's Track & Field/Cross Country Academic All-OAC Team



## Four are Unanimous Selections to Academic All-OAC Men's Track and Field/Cross Country First Team

**Twinsburg, OH** -- Two Heidelberg runners and a pair of Wilmington track and field athletes were unanimous choices to the Academic All-Ohio Athletic Conference (OAC) Men's Track and Field/Cross Country First Team. 'Berg seniors **Nathan Gibson (Covington)** and **Brendon Moody (Ohio City/Van Wert)** and the Wilmington duo of **Zachary Irelan (Kettering/Fairmont)** and **Kyle Wolf (Cincinnati/Anderson)** were unanimous choices to the 2003 First Team.

Gibson, Moody and Irelan were also repeat selections to the OAC First Team. Gibson carries a 3.64 grade-point average in accounting and business, Moody a 3.83 in middle childhood education, Irelan a 3.71 in psychology and Wolf holds a 3.45 gpa in communications.

A total of 22 track and field student-athletes have been named to this year's Academic All-OAC Team.

To qualify for the Academic All-OAC Track and Field/Cross Country Team, a student-athlete must have a minimum cumulative gpa of 3.0, must have been a starter or key reserve who has made a significant athletic impact and be in at least his second year of participation in his sport. The Academic All-OAC Team is voted on by the OAC's faculty athletics representatives.
