Fries, Ruberg and Schefft Unanimous Selections to 2002 Academic All-OAC Men's Basketball Team

Cleveland, OH -- Ohio Northern junior **Aaron Fries (Norwalk/St. Paul)**, Capital junior guard **Anthony Ruberg (Cincinnati/LaSalle)** and Baldwin-Wallace senior guard **Jason Schefft (Mentor)** were unanimous selections the Academic All-OAC Men's Basketball First Team. Fries carries a 3.88 grade-point average (gpa) in political science and business administration, Ruberg has a 3.60 gpa in economics and Schefft carries a 3.49 gpa in health and physical education.
