## Two Student-Athletes Are Repeat Selections on 2002 Academic All-OAC Men's At-Large First Team

**Twinsburg, OH** -- Two student-athletes are repeat selections to the 2002 Academic All-Ohio Athletic Conference (OAC) Men's At-Large First Team. Baldwin-Wallace senior tennis player **Bryan Bartunek (Warren/Harding)** and John Carroll senior wrestler **Mike Markovic (Brecksville/Brecksville-Broadview Hts.)** repeat on the Academic All-OAC First Team. Bartunek carries a 3.62 grade-point average (gpa) in business administration and Markovic has a 3.75 gpa in biology/premedicine. Five student-athletes were unanimous picks to the 2002 First Team.

To qualify for the Academic All-OAC Men's At-Large Team, a student-athlete must have a minimum cumulative gpa of 3.0, must have been a starter or key reserve who has made a significant athletic impact in matches/meets/tournaments etc. and be in at least his second year of participation in his sport. The Academic All-OAC Men's At-Large Team consists of student-athletes from the sports of golf, swimming and diving, tennis and wrestling. The Academic All-OAC Team is voted on by the OAC's faculty athletics representatives.
