## ONU's Fries and Capital's Ruberg Repeat Selections to Academic All-OAC Men's Basketball First Team

**Twinsburg, OH --** Ohio Northern's **Aaron Fries (Norwalk/St. Paul)** and Capital's **Tony Ruberg (Cincinnati/LaSalle)** are repeat selections to the Academic All-OAC First Team. Fries carries a 3.91 grade point average in political science and Ruberg has a 3.66 gpa in economics. Both are joined on the 2003 First Team by four other unanimous selections.

A total of 11 student-athletes have been named to the 2003 Academic All-OAC Team, representing seven of the 10 OAC schools.
