## Capital's Goodwin and Baldwin-Wallace's Davis Receive OAC Men's Basketball Awards

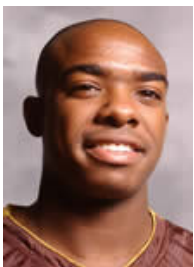
**Austintown, OH** – Capital Head Coach **Damon Goodwin** and Baldwin-Wallace senior wing **Tori Davis (Elyria/Open Door Christian)** are the recipients of the 2007 Ohio Athletic Conference (OAC) men's basketball special awards. Goodwin was voted the Men's Coach-of-the-Year and Davis is the recipient of the Mike Gregory Awards. Both awards are voted on by the league.



**Damon Goodwin** has been named the OAC Men's Basketball Coach-of-the-Year for the second time in his 13 year career. Goodwin also earned this honor in 1996. This is the second time the Crusaders have won the OAC regular season title, but the first time as OAC Tournament champions under Goodwin's direction. Goodwin and his Crusaders won the OAC regular season title in 2002-2003 with a 15-3 record.

Capital will be making its second appearance in the NCAA tournament with Goodwin at the helm since the 1995-1996 season. Goodwin currently carries a 201-138 record in 13 years of coaching at Capital. Five years ago, he led Capital to a school-record 23 wins, while three years ago he brought the school its first OAC title in 19 seasons.

Baldwin-Wallace senior wing **Tori Davis** is the recipient of the 2007 Mike Gregory Award for the second straight year. Davis is the just the fourth Yellow Jacket to garner this prestigious award. The award is presented to the most outstanding player in the Conference. The award was established in 1957 in honor of Mike Gregory of Denison University, who was a multi-sport standout prior to his graduation in 1929.



Davis leads the Conference in scoring (22.4, 606), is second in field goal percentage (.647, 209-323) and third in rebounding (9.1, 245) and blocked shots (2.19, 59). He led the Yellow Jackets to an 18-9 overall record and a 12-7 OAC mark this season and was named to the OAC All-Tournament team.

Davis ends his career seventh on the all-time OAC scoring list with 2,232 points. Davis also had 950 career rebounds to rank fifth, and is B-W's all-time leading shot blocker with 242.

Davis is a four-time All-OAC pick, including a three-time First Team honoree.
