OHIO ATHLETIC CONFERENCE

The Ohio Athletic Conference, the third oldest conference in college athletics, is predated only by the Michigan Intercollegiate Athletic Association (1888) and the Big Ten (1895). The Conference is older than the World Series and even the NCAA itself and has survived two world wars, the Great Depression, the Korean War and the Vietnam Conflict. From a modest beginning of six charter members in 1902, the OAC grew to as many as 24 members in the mid-1920s.

Through the years a total of 31 colleges and universities at one time or another have been members of the OAC. Currently the Conference consists of 10 members, including Baldwin-Wallace College, Capital University, Heidelberg College, John Carroll University, Marietta College, Mount Union College, Muskingum College, Ohio Northern University, Otterbein College and Wilmington College. Wilmington became the 31st OAC member school, on July 1, 2000.

In the OAC's first year of existence, 1902, the first Conference champion was crowned — Case Tech won the football title with a 5-0-0 record. Outdoor track was added a year later and a third sport, cross country, became a Conference sport in 1914. More sports were steadily added to the OAC's repertoire throughout the years, culminating in the addition of women's sports in 1984. The Conference currently sponsors championships in 21 sports, 11 men's and 10 women's.

The enrollments at the 10 OAC institutions range from 1,200 to 4,500. All of the schools were founded in the 19th century and have long and outstanding academic reputations.

OAC Previews

Baldwin-Wallace: The 2007 Baldwin-Wallace College baseball team will seek a spot in this spring's Ohio Athletic Conference Tournament. As most NCAA Division III baseball observers know, if you are good enough to qualify for the season-ending four-team tourney, you are good enough to win the 2007 NCAA Division III baseball title. OAC rival Marietta College did it last year and B-W would like to duplicate that effort this spring.

The Yellow Jackets ended the 2005-2006 season with a 19-19 overall record. It marked the eighth time in the last nine years that the Yellow Jackets posted a .500 or better record, including nine consecutive years with 18 or more victories. It continued a tradition of excellent baseball at the College.

This spring, veteran B-W Head Coach Dr. Robert "Bob" Fisher, 635-560-12 in 38 years, returns a solid group of veterans on the mound but must fill a number of holes in the lineup due to the graduation of an outstanding senior class of 2006.

Gone are 2006 graduates Dan Melito, Matt Wilson, Matt Green, Mike Farrell and Kevin Brown. All five played key roles on the varsity for four years. Back to lead the 2007 version of Fisher's attack are senior catcher and relief pitcher Bob Storesina (Canton/ GlenOak), junior outfielder Shaun Slater (Wooster/ Norwayne) and sophomore center fielder Cody Kidd (Wellington) and sophomore first baseman/ designated hitter Riley Kreisher (Ashtabula/ Edgewood). Storesina batted .292 with three doubles, two homers and 15 RBI. Slater hit .325 with five doubles and 23 RBI. Kidd hit .319 in 47 at-bats with 15 runs scored and a team-leading 10 stolen bases in 12 attempts. Kreisher batted .300 with a triple, homer and 10 RBI in 50 at-bats.

In addition, look for junior third basemen Nick Radca (Amherst/ Steele) and Gerald Breedlove (Painesville/ Riverside) to both contribute. Radca hit .222 with two doubles, a triple and six RBI in 45 at-bats and Breedlove hit .208 with a double in 24 at-bats. Others who will move from the junior varsity to the varsity and hope to make an impact include sophomore outfielders Mike Brisky (Berea) and Andrew Middleman (Reisterstown, Md./ Franklin), junior second baseman Nate Luken (Dayton/ Chaminade-Julienne), junior catcher Dom Palmucci (Millersburg/ West Holmes) and junior pitcher/ infielder Kevin Shenker (Twinsburg).

On the mound, B-W will return its entire pitching staff in 2006-2007. It includes senior starters Clayton Kynkor (Auburn Township/ Kenston), Jim Wochele (Richmond Heights) and Brian Pille (Lorain/ Catholic), Shenker, senior relief ace J.D. Fullerton (Cuyahoga Falls), sophomore Alex Walker (Massillon/ Perry) and Storesina. In addition, sophomore Jim Jaskowak (Grove City, Pa./ Grove City) saw varsity action a year ago.

Kynkor tied a school single-season record with 11 starts this spring and was 6-4 with a 4.34 earned run average and had five complete games and a team-leading 66 and one-third innings of work. He now has a 10-4 career mark.

Pille started 10 games this spring and was 3-3 overall. Wochele started eight games, was 3-4 overall and had a team-leading 31 strikeouts. Fredericks started four times and Shenker twice and both showed promise for the future.

In the bullpen, Fullerton made 16 appearances and now owns the B-W career-record with 28 in the past three years. He was 2-1 with one save in 23 and two-thirds innings of work. Walker had a 3-1 mark in nine appearances, including one start and had a team-leading 1.10 ERA in 16 and one-third innings pitched. Storesina came out of his catcher position to be the "stopper" and had three saves and a 4.00 ERA in eight appearances covering nine innings. Jaskowak made seven relief appearances and tossed a total of 13 and two-thirds innings.

Overall, look for Fisher to have another strong squad in 2007 that will seek to have another 20-win season and advance to the four-team OAC Tournament and have a shot at a first-ever NCAA Division III baseball title.

Capital: Capital University's baseball team is poised for a breakout season in 2007. The Crusaders return starters in seven of the eight field positions and seven pitchers from a squad that had the team's best finish since 1995 and missed the Ohio Athletic Conference

Tournament by only one game.

Capital returns its top four hitters led by the All-OAC duo of outfielders in junior Marc St. John and senior Jake Butler. St. John and Butler finished the regular season each of the last two years as the conference's top hitter. St. John hit .440 in 2006 on his way to All-OAC Second Team honors, while Butler hit .367 last season as he earned All-OAC honors for a second straight year.

Also back is sophomore infielder and designated hitter Nick Snider is back after hitting .312 with 22 runs batted in as a freshman, along with junior infielder Ryan, who hit .310 with nine doubles and a triple last season. Seniors in third baseman Graham Holmberg, who topped the team with 30 RBI's and five homers, outfielder Jimmy Haas, utility player Will Rutherford and junior Andy Daggett round out the returners in the field.

Seven pitchers that tossed at least 10 innings and accounted for two-thirds of the innings pitched last year are back. Sophomore Nick Brown leads the staff as he was second on the team in innings pitched and wins a year ago. Three other starters in juniors Mike Graffin, Chris Trainer and senior Bryan White all return along with Holmberg in the closer role where he had four saves in 2006. Sophomores in Nathan Raines and Isiah James add depth to the rotation.

Heidelberg: The Heidelberg College baseball team has built a championship caliber team under the guidance of Matt Palm and success has been a constant over the last seven years and looks to continue into 2007. Heidelberg will strive for its seventh appearance in the post season, including its fifth-consecutive behind its team's athleticism and the senior leadership of Tyler Tocco, Alex Rutter, Matt Decker and Dan Machovina.

Infield

Tocco, a two-time All-Ohio Athletic Conference honoree, is a three-year starter that will be looked upon to provide leadership from behind the plate. Backing Tocco will be Matt Hille and freshman Steve Decker. Rutter rounded out 2006 on a high note, hitting .417 in conference games, and will be looked at to control first base for the second-straight season.

A young, but experienced veteran returns at third base in 2007 in OAC First Team honoree Tony Pawlowicz. In his freshman campaign, Pawlowicz finished third on the team with a .325 batting average, 49 hits and 30 RBIs.

Matt Decker will control things in the middle of the field from his shortstop position. Matt Decker is a versatile player that assisted on a team-high 104 plays in his junior campaign as well as served as a threat on the base paths, recording 21 stolen bases.

Bringing added depth up the middle will be sophomores Ben Way and L.B. Emrhein and freshman Dan McFarland. All three could see action at second base and offer an alternative at short stop.

Outfield

Sophomore Jeremy Wentworth will lead a strong core of outfielders in 2007. Wentworth will move from left field to center to fill the void left by the graduation of the 2006 Rawlings ABCA All-American A.J. Schlea. He also returns as the Berg's leadoff hitter with 53 hits in 2006, which ranked second on the team. Supporting Wentworth in the outfield will be sophomore Biagio Boytim in left field and junior Steve Calevro or freshman Everett Thomas in right field.

Palm will look to his sophomore class to fill a vacant designated hitter position left from the move of Boytim to the outfield. When not in the field, Jack Bault or Matt Grassley as well as Matt Hille could push for time at the plate.

Pitching

Providing a back bone to the success of the Berg will be its action on the pitcher's mound led by all-conference left-hander David Paddock. Paddock, a sophomore, posted a 4-2 record as a freshman on the mound, while striking out 49 would-be batters. Also looking to gain consistent starts on the mound will be Matt Decker, who saw some action in his freshman campaign, and Andrew McFarland. McFarland finished 2-1 in seven appearances on the mound a season ago.

Newcomer Andrew Hamman and sophomore Bryan Hartman will be part of the Berg's starting rotation, while sophomore T.J. Grof could push for a starting position, but provides a solid arm coming out of the

bull pen. Calevro will help to fill the closer role that was left vacant by the graduation of all-conference player Jared Wolf.

John Carroll: John Carroll University's baseball head coach Marc Thibeault has high hopes for this upcoming 2007 season. That being said, Thibeault – now in his eighth season as the Blue Streaks skipper – knows all too well that hoping is not always enough.

"We've really been working on endurance," said Thibeault. "Our guys need to be able to make it through a nine-inning game and withstand our tough conference schedule, all at the same time performing well enough to get the win."

In 2006, the Blue Streak baseball squad finished with an overall record of 21-17 and posted an 8-10 record in the Ohio Athletic Conference -- finishing tied for fifth with two other teams, Capital and Muskingum. The team had a taste of success finishing above .500, but without a playoff berth, there is always room for improvement.

Junior Sean McCarthy returns as the team's offensive leader and most experienced outfielder. Last year, McCarthy led the team in virtually every offensive category, including batting average (.398)

Infielders Dan Sabella (started 38 games in 2006), Douglas Snider (started 33 games in 2006), Dan Madden (.377 batting average), Adam Sockel and Adam Milanovich have all had made a number of starts over the course of their careers and will provide leadership both at the plate and in the field.

The pitching staff is working with a lot of depth. Senior Matt McKinnon (14 career starts and 30 appearances) and junior Matt Fort (All-OAC in 2005) will headline the staff.

Regardless of who throws, Thibeault is looking to either Russell Toth or Chris Cairo to anchor the staff behind the plate.

The Blue Streaks hope the taste of success from last season will carry over for 2007. Thibeault wants his players to stay focused and take one game at a time.

"The next step, making it to the playoffs, will happen if the team starts off strong and finishes even stronger."

Marietta: The Etta Express, under the direction of fourth-year Head Coach Brian Brewer, will have another long road ahead of itself in 2007. Marietta will have to replace many of the major contributors to the 2006 National Championship squad, including four of its top five pitchers as well as the team's center fielder, catcher and two middle-of-the-order bats. Three of those players—senior Mike DeMark (San Diego Padres), senior Jarrod Klausman (Washington Wild Things) and junior Mike Eisenberg (Cleveland Indians)—signed professional contracts after the season.

The Pioneers return just six lettermen—four every day players and one starting pitcher—from last year's 43-1 1 squad, which captured the program's fourth national championship. Marietta also won national championships in 1981 1983 and 1986.

Senior shortstop Ryan Eschbaugh, senior second baseman Ryan Belanger, senior first baseman Joe Litke, junior right fielder Tony Piconke, junior designated hitter Tom Doty and sophomore pitcher Jason Baumler—who all played key roles in Marietta's championship run—return to lead the young Pioneers in 2007.

Litke, a second team All-Region and first team All-Ohio Athletic Conference selection, returns after a breakout season in 2006. In 52 games, the left-handed hitter batted .401 (61-of-152) with 41 runs scored, both of which ranked second on the team.

Belanger, also a first team All-OAC honoree, finished fourth on the team in hitting with a .325 average (67-of-206). He also led the Pioneers in runs scored (57), doubles (13) and stolen bases (16).

Injuries plagued both Eschbaugh and Piconke at times in the batter's box but they were solid defensively throughout last season. Eschbaugh finished the year hitting .263 (41-of-156) but batted .320 (8-of-25) in the postseason. Piconke hit .280 (53-of-189) during the regular season but went 2-for-4 with a

home run in the national championship game. Doty played sparingly during the season but

made the most of his postseason opportunities, earning MVP honors at the NCAA Midwest Regional. In six postseason games, Doty batted .615 (8-of-13); he will look to carry that confidence into this season.

Baumler, with just one year under his belt, will be asked to carry the load for the young pitching staff early in the season. Baumler went 8-2 with 40 strikeouts and a 3.57 ERA in 75 2/3 innings of work last year.

Sophomores Justin Merryman and T.J. Knowlton, who combined for just 17 appearances, one start and 20 2/3 innings, are the only other Pioneers to see significant varsity time on the mound in 2006.

Mount Union: Mount Union College's 2007 baseball team returns a veteran squad this spring with 13 of 14 letterwinners from 2006, eight of nine starters, and 11 seniors overall from last year's team (23-17, 10-8 OAC) which finished fourth in the Ohio Athletic Conference regular season and third in tournament play.

The Raiders will likely be led by junior/outfielder Andy Warner (North Canton/Hoover), who was a First-Team All-OAC selection and Division III Third Team All-Region honoree in 2006. Warner batted a team-best .379 with three homers and 39 RBI, also a team-high.

Mount Union also returns senior/pitcher Shawn Kerek (Stow), who earned Second-Team All-OAC honors after finishing the season with a 5-4 record and team-bests in ERA (3.35) and innings pitched (75.0).

Other key returnees on the Raider pitching staff include senior/pitchers Mike Reynolds (Akron/Hoban) and Tommy Kerr (Pickerington/Central). Reynolds tied for second on the team with five wins while Kerr also recorded five wins and struck out 55 batters in 54.2 innings of work.

Returning senior position players include centerfielder Jason Evans (Canton/McKinley), who batted .372, middle infielder Justin Marx (Canton/GlenOak), a .311 hitter, third baseman Paul Namey (Hermitage, PA/Kennedy Catholic), a .292 hitter, middle infielder Josh Faltot (Mercer, PA), who drove in 20 runs and recorded four triples, and outfielders Jon Suntala (Columbia Station/Columbia) and Chris Fadden (Medina). Suntala was fourth on the team with 20 RBI while Fadden saw action in 24 games last spring. Junior/catcher Jon Schulz (Chardon/Notre Dame-Cathedral Latin) also returns after batting .288 with 13 RBI in 2006.

In 2006, Mount Union tied the school single-season record for wins (23), originally set in 1991 and 2000. Overall in 2006, the Raiders finished fifth in the OAC in hitting (.308 BA), and sixth in pitching (4.91 ERA) and fielding (.945).

Muskingum: Head Coach Gregg Thompson enters his 12th season at the helm of the Fighting Muskie program on the verge of etching his name into the record book.

Thompson sits with 237 career wins, just three wins shy of breaking the Muskingum career wins record of 239 held by the former late skipper Ron Mazerowski. Thompson also has other reasons to be excited for the 2007 campaign. The Muskies return the bulk of their lineup that led the Ohio Athletic Conference in batting average and runs scored per game and return a pitching staff that ranked among the best in the conference.

The offensive assault will be led by seniors Shawn Galloway and Bill Rockwell, juniors Brock Huntsman and Seth Sibert and sophomores Adam Smith, Levi Shaw and Tyler Gibbs.

Galloway, a first team All-OAC honoree last season, batted a team-high .395 with 60 hits, 39 runs, 27 RBI and 18 doubles. Rockwell, an All-OAC selection, has started every game (116) in his career. Rockwell produced a breakout year in 2006 with career-high numbers in batting average (.357), at-bats (126), runs (38), hits (45) and RBI (27).

Huntsman, a first team all-conference honoree, led the squad with 31 RBI en route to a career-high .373 batting average. Sibert hit a career-best .347 with 42 hits, 25 RBI and eight doubles.

Smith, Shaw and Gibbs gave the Black & Magenta solid production. Smith hit .302 with 28 RBI and 26 runs, while starting 34 games in right field. Shaw batted .294 with 15 hits and seven RBI and Gibbs saw action in 16 contests and batted .313.

On the mound, the fourth-ranked Muskie conference pitching staff returns ace Jason Tomlinson (senior), Aubrey Neuhart (soph.), Shaw (sophomore), Karl Stevens (sophomore), Ryan McCallister (sophomore) and Tony Yarnall (sophomore).

Tomlinson tossed 46 innings and appeared in a team-high 15 games. Neuhart posted a 3.73 ERA and tied the Muskingum all-time record for fewest walks in a season with four. Shaw logged a 4.03 ERA

in 28 innings of work and Stevens went 2-1 in 34.1 innings of work. Both of Stevens' wins came against two teams ranked in the top-25 of the nation. Yarnall appeared in eight outings and recorded a 2.70 ERA, while McCallister posted a 3.38 ERA in an injury-shortened season.

Ohio Northern: The 2006 season was a tough one for the Ohio Northern baseball team and first year head coach Justin Bergman.

Despite the 6-33 overall mark in the Ohio Athletic Conference, Bergman was encouraged by the team's gritty play. The Polar Bears found themselves one-run short on 11 difference occasions including a stretch of four straight one-run loss.

Despite the sunpar record, several individuals had standout season.

One of the standouts was junior Josh Conkey. Conkey led the team in nearly every offensive category including batting average (.376), runs scored (28) hits (48), triples (3), home runs (4), on-base-percentage (.432) and runs batted in (29).

Conkey earned Honorable Mention All-OAC honors in 2006 as well as First Team Academic All-OAC.

Conkey also led the Polar Bears on the mound, pitching the second most innings with 62.1 and leading the team with 48 strikeouts and seven complete games. He finished the season with a 5.63 ERA and a hard luck 1-8 record.

Sophomore Mike Henfling led the team with a .500 batting average and two doubles through the first 11 games before a broken thumb hampered him the rest of the season. Mike finished the season with a .276 average and nine runs batted in.

Junior Phil Bruns also had a solid season.

Bruns started 34 games and batted .298 with 31 hits and 12 runs batted in. Bruns was also a leader in the field, committing just three errors in 257 chances and having a .988 fielding percentage.

Junior Robby Stoffer and sophomore Andrew Wieland each had 14 hits in 67 plate appearances.

Stoffer started 22 games in the outfield and had a .974 fielding percentage.

Wieland played in 26 games and was third on the team with nine stolen bases.

Conkey, junior Scott Bruckman and sophomore Nick Simoff were the work horses of the pitching staff. The trio combined to pitch over 149 innings.

Bruckman pitched a team-high 65.2 innings in 14 appearances with a 1-9 record and a 7.40 ERA. Bruckman threw six complete games, striking out 38 and walking just 23 batters.

Junior Mark Sankovich led the staff with a 3.54 ERA in nine games. Sankovich pitched 20.1 innings and struck out 20 while walking just 10.

Freshman J.C. Valentour also made an impact on the mound in his first season. Valentour was 2-1 with a 7.23 ERA in 23.2 innings. He made four starts and had one complete game.

Otterbein: Otterbein, defending Ohio Athletic Conference (OAC) regular-season and two-time OAC Tournament champion, heads into 2007 with a big No. 1 on its back.

The Cardinals, just one win away from making the 2006 NCAA Division III World Series, open the new season ranked No. 1 in NCAA Division III, according to the American Baseball Coaches Association/Collegiate Baseball preseason poll.

"If somebody has to bear the burden of being the preseason No. 1, let it be us," said eighth-year head coach George Powell. "We were always fighting to get the respect and now that we've gotten it, it's a motivating source. Our players know the target is on us."

Otterbein returns 31 of 32 lettermen, including the entire starting lineup, from last season's squad that produced a school record 34 wins.

The squad finished at 34-16 overall and won the OAC regular-season title with a 16-2 mark. The Cardinals advanced into the NCAA Division III Tournament for the second straight year, reaching the championship game of the Rose-Hulman Midwest Regional. Otterbein lost to eventual national champion Marietta, 8-7, in 11 innings in the regional final.

Juniors Dan Remenowsky and Doug Stevens, both right-handers,

headline the group of five returning starters to the Cardinal pitching staff.

Remenowsky compiled a 9-2 record and 1.94 ERA (second best in the OAC) on his way to third team All-America honors last season. A first team All-OAC and All-Midwest selection, Remenowsky was named the Kent Tekulve OAC Pitcher of the Year. He finished second in the OAC with 94 strikeouts.

Stevens, a first team All-OAC and All-Midwest Region pick, led the pitching staff with a perfect 10-0 record. He recorded a 2.47 ERA and struck out 64 while walking only 13 batters.

First baseman Bobby Wright, a senior, right fielder Jerry Tulga, a senior, and shortstop Ben Titus, a junior, form the heart of the Cardinal starting lineup.

Wright, a .275 hitter, collected six home runs and 33 RBI last season. He also made eight appearances on the mound, compiling a 2-3 record, which included a 4-1 win over Marietta in the first game of the Midwest Regional final.

Tulga, an honorable mention All-OAC selection, ranked among the top six in the OAC for batting average (.420), slugging percentage (.580), and on-base percentage (.480).

Titus, named to the first team All-OAC and All-Midwest Region, batted .373 and ranked among the top seven in the OAC for hits (63), total bases (85), sacrifice bunts (7), sacrifice flies (5), at-bats (169) and total plate appearances (200).

Also returning to the starting lineup are second team All-OAC performers Chris Kovanda (.331), a junior left fielder, Chris Martin (.328), a senior catcher, and Pat Connor (.301), a junior center fielder.

Rounding out the list of returning starters are Tyler Rudman (.304), a sophomore, and Mike Griffin (.349), a junior, who split time at second baseman; Brandon Mauck (.280), a junior third baseman; and Kyle Dyer (.272), a junior designated hitter and first baseman.

Wilmington: Wilmington College will field a senior-laden squad on the diamond this spring as the Quakers look to improve on last season's 15-19 record.

"We've got a lot of seniors, guys that are three- and four-year starters," eighth-year WC head coach Tony Haley said. "These guys have been around the OAC and know what it takes to win in this tough conference."

Depth in pitching is where Wilmington has placed its off-season focus. Back are starters Jamison George, Ronnie Campbell and Kenny Branscom while freshman Bryce DeWeese is expected to challenge for time in the Quakers' rotation. The pitchers will throw to senior Ben Butler, one of the OAC's best all-around catchers.

"From the Little League to the Major League, pitching is the name of the game," Haley said. "We have a veteran staff this year and we have some quality newcomers who are going to give us a deeper staff. Our philosophy is to throw strikes. If we can work ahead of the hitters, we're going to compete."

Several key position players are back from last season's squad that hit a collective .302. Shortstop Greg Krieger and center fielder Taylor Clark were among the OAC's leading hitters while first baseman Mike Kroeger is always a long-ball threat. Top newcomers include outfielder Jason Iles, a proven hitter, and second baseman Tyler Ledford. Wilmington opens its season March 6 at Div. I Wright State University.

ALL-TIME OAC PLAYERS-OF-THE-YEAR

The OAC Kent Tekulve Pitcher-of-the-Year was first presented in 1995. Prior to that, the OAC awarded only the single most outstanding player with an award -- the Jack Rafeld Award. The Jack Rafeld Award has been presented since 1978.

The OAC Pitcher-of-the-Year award is named after 1969 Marietta graduate Kent Tekulve, who spent 21 seasons playing professional baseball, including 17 seasons with the Pittsburgh Pirates. He was a key member of the Pirates' 1979 World Series championship team, setting a major league record with three saves in the Series against Baltimore. He broke Hoyt Wilhelm's record of 1,018 career relief appearances. Tekulve finished his professional career with 1,050 games played, 184 saves and a 94-90 record.

The OAC Player-of-the-Year award is named in honor of one of Mount Union's most successful coaches, Jack Rafeld. Rafeld served in various capacities from 1946-79 in MTU's physical education and athletics department. In 30 years as the baseball coach, Rafeld guided the Purple Raiders to an overall record of 304-220-3.
