2008 Baseball Manual

The 2006-07 year proved, once again, why the OAC is one of the most prestigious Division III conferences in the country. Mount Union football team won its record ninth NCAA national title, while Capital advanced to the NCAA Quarterfinals. Marietta baseball, the defending national champions, advanced to the eight-team Division III World Series. John Carroll Men's Basketball, Baldwin-Wallace Wrestling and Ohio Northern Women's Golf all finished among the NCAA "Sweet 16", while Mount Union men's outdoor Track and Field placed among the NCAA "elite eight".

Individually, the Conference was represented by 74 All-Americans and a number of national titles in track and field. Mount Union's Justin Rodhe won the outdoor shot put title, Heidelberg's Greg Tyson claimed both the indoor and outdoor long jump title, and Ohio Northern's Jimmy O'Brien took home the indoor and outdoor 800-meter run title.

Academically, the OAC boasted numerous CoSIDA ESPN the Magazine Academic All-Americans, along with regional and national coaching honors. The Ohio Athletic Conference, the third oldest conference in college athletics, is predated only by the Michigan Intercollegiate Athletic Association (1888) and the Big Ten (1895). The Conference is older than the World Series and even the NCAA itself and has survived two world wars, the Great Depression, the Korean War and the Vietnam Conflict. From a modest beginning of six charter members in 1902, the OAC grew to as many as 24 members in the mid-1920s.

Through the years a total of 31 colleges and universities at one time or another have been members of the OAC. Currently the Conference consists of 10 members, including Baldwin-Wallace College, Capital University, Heidelberg College, John Carroll University, Marietta College, Mount Union College, Muskingum College, Ohio Northern University, Otterbein College and Wilmington College. Wilmington became the 31st OAC member school, on July 1, 2000.

In the OAC's first year of existence, 1902, the first Conference champion was crowned Case Tech won the football title with a 5-0-0 record. Outdoor track was added a year later and a third sport, cross country, became a Conference sport in 1914. More sports were steadily added to the OAC's repertoire throughout the years, culminating in the addition of women's sports in 1984. The Conference currently sponsors championships in 21 sports, 11 men's and 10 women's.

The enrollments at the 10 OAC institutions range from 1,200 to 4,500. All of the schools were founded in the 19th century and have long and outstanding academic reputations.

While maintaining these high academic standards, Ohio Athletic Conference athletic teams and athletes have consistently enjoyed a great deal of success on a regional and national level. The athletic competition is viewed not as an end in itself, but as an extension of the educational programs.

2008 Team Previews

Baldwin-Wallace: The Baldwin-Wallace College baseball team will look to its veteran talent to have a much-improved season than one season ago. With eight fulltime starters back and some good, young and talented pitchers returning, veteran Head Coach Bob Fisher is optimistic about his team's chances in 2008.

Following a disappointing 2007 season when the Yellow Jackets compiled a 15-20 overall and 8-10 Ohio Athletic Conference record, the '08 returning veterans dedicated themselves to having a better season this spring. Look for junior All-OAC and Academic All-OAC center fielder Cody Kidd (Wellington) and All-OAC first baseman Riley Kreisher (Ashtabula/ Edgewood) to lead the charge and be two of the best players in the OAC if not all of Division III baseball.

Kreisher was second on the team with an .370 batting average with 10 doubles, a triple, three homeruns and 33 RBI. He is equally impressive in the field and made one error in 2007 and had an outstanding .996 fielding percentage. Kidd hit a team leading .382 with four doubles, four triples, three homers and added 42 runs scored, 22 RBI and stole 16 bases in 17 attempts. He also was hit-by-pitch 13 times, drew 15 walks and had a .484 on-base average.

In addition to Kreisher at first base, senior Nate Luken (Dayton/ Chaminade Julianne), senior Nick Radca (Amherst/ Steele) and senior Gerald Breedlove (Painesville/ Riverside) are back at second base, shortstop and third base, respectively. In addition to Midd in center field, junior Mike Brisky (Berea) and senior Shaun Slater (Wooster/ Norwayne) return in right and left field, respectively. Brisky hit .362 with six doubles and 18 RBI. Also, look for junior Matt Bolte (Jupiter, Fla./ William T. Dwyer) to move from being last year's designated hitter to behind the plate after batting .333 with two homers and a team-leading 37 RBI in '07 and for junior 3B Jake Gross to see more action this spring after batting .267 in 45 at-bats.

The Jacket pitching staff graduated its number one starter and second-team All-OAC closer Bob Storesina, but returns senior Kevin Shenker (Twinsburg), juniors Jim Palko (Euclid), Jim Jaskowak (Grove City) and Brandon Fredericks (Copley/ Revere) and sophomores Alex Walker (Massillon/ Perry), Justin Novak (Strongsville), Corey Hanawalt (Doylestown/ Akron St. Vincent - St. Mary) and Scott Luthman (Celina). Palko led the group with a 2-1 record with a 2.64 earned run average and a pair of complete games. Shenker also will see some playing time in the OF.

Capital: When not on the baseball diamond, Capital University head baseball coach Greg Weyrich builds homes among other things. Like any good builder, Weyrich knows that every structure is only as good as the foundation under it. He hopes that the groundwork laid a year ago as the Crusaders made the OAC Tournament for only the second-time ever and advanced to the championship round for the first time in school history is just the foundation the Capital baseball program needs support another season among the conference elite in 2008.

But unlike building a house, Weyrich, the 2007 OAC Coach of the Year, will have to change some his tools in 2008 as he must replace his top two hitters in All-Mideast Region selections Jake Butler, the 2007 OAC Player of the Year and Jimmy Haas.

His tool box is far from empty though as the Crusaders return eight position players that each started at least 10 games and seven pitchers that accounted for 15 of Capital's 20 wins in 2007.

All-OAC selections in junior third baseman Tom Steverson and senior outfielder Marc St. John lead the returners. In just his first season at Capital, Steverson hit .360, tied for the team-lead in doubles with 11, was second on the squad in RBI (35) and was the only Crusader to play in all 41 games last season. St. John hit .387 with a team-high 39 runs scored and did not make error in 56 chances in the outfield. The remainder of a veteran core of returning position players includes seniors in second baseman Ryan Hutchison, shortstop Andy Daggett and utility player Chris Stemberge along with juniors in catcher Nick Snider and outfielders Isiah James and Mike St. John.

On the mound, senior Chris Trainer led the team in wins a year ago, while junior Nick Brown led the squad in strikeouts and was an OAC All-Tournament team selection. They will be joined by senior Michael Graffin and junior Nathan Raines along with a trio of talented sophomores

in Matt Uy, Nick Dewitt and Justin Stegman.

Position players Zach Byers, David Barteck, Steven Veenstra and John Rowan along with 6-10 right handed pitcher Jimmy Van Buren headline a talented freshman class.

The Crusaders will again start their season with a southern swing that includes three games at the Cal Ripken Baseball Complex in Myrtle Beach, S.C., and then games in Fayetteville, N.C. against Methodist, Rocky Mount, N.C. versus N.C. Wesleyan and in Danville, Va., against Averett.

Capital's home opener is Tuesday, March. 25 against Wittenberg at Clowson Field.

Heidelberg: Over the course of the last eight years, the Heidelberg College baseball program and head coach Matt Palm have focused on producing top-level teams not only in the Ohio Athletic Conference, but within the nation. Year in and year out the pieces have been there, having led to a conference championship in 2003 and 2007, as well as a tournament title in 2004 and an appearance in the NCAA Regionals. In 2008, the program will continue to cement the pieces together and build on its foundation of championship caliber teams that began under Palm's tutelage.

"When you have a good program the end results stay the same," stated Palm. "It is just the names that change." That holds true this season for the Berg who lost four senior leaders from its 2007 OAC Regular Season Championship team, but renovation has already begun for the 2008 team which is held together by 15 returning letter winners.

Providing structure to the team will be its outfield that returns all three starters highlighted by All-OAC honorees Jeremy Wentworth, who was also an All-Mideast honoree, and Jack Bault, along with Matt Grassley. Despite losing a bulk of its infield to graduation, which included three all-league performers, Heidelberg returns starters Tony Pawlowicz and L.B. Emrhein to help guide the team in the infield. A host of letter winners that proved to be a consistent force when given opportunities a season ago will be joining Pawlowicz and Emrhein on the field.

Heidelberg has its deepest team ever on the mound in 2008. Leading the way for the third-straight season is two-time all-conference performer and 2007 All-Mideast Region honoree junior David Paddock and senior right-hander Andrew McFarland. McFarland became a mainstay on the mound as a junior which saw him share team honors with Paddock with seven victories. For his efforts McFarland earned All-OAC Second Team honors a year ago. Another all-conference pitcher returning for the Berg is senior Steve Calevro. Calevro made 19 appearances on the mound and finished the year with a 6-1 record.

Cementing the pieces of the 2008 team together will take place every time the Berg steps onto the field. With an athletic team that provides a lot of depth and versatility Heidelberg's championship foundation will be extended early to help defend its conference title from a season ago and follow that up with a lengthy stint in the playoffs.

John Carroll: The John Carroll University baseball team did not intend to answer the question of how a team can lead the league in batting average and earned run average and not make the postseason ... but it did. That answer was to rank last in fielding percentage.

"It shows you how fickle the game of baseball is," said ninth-year head coach Mark Thibeault. "Poor defense can waste your best efforts at the plate and on the mound. We learned that lesson the hard way."

With seven starters returning in the field, and three-fourths of the pitching rotation back, expectations will be high in 2008 for the Blue Streaks.

First team All-OAC pitcher Matt McKinnon took his league-leading ERA with him when he graduated last May, but returning are seniors Matt Fort (13 career wins) and Brandon Kurtz (6-3, 45 K in 2007).

Junior Paul O'Donnell will also return to a starting role, while senior closer Marty Smith will anchor the bullpen.

"Losing Matt McKinnon will be tough to overcome because he was so reliable over the last two years," said Thibeault. "That being said, we have enormous confidence in the pitchers we still have on the roster. They have all proven themselves in conference play."

Offensively, JCU will rely on senior first team All-OAC hitter Adam Sockel (.391, 38 RBI to equal or better his 2007 numbers. Thibeault also has the luxury to turn to a pair of batters who hit over .400 in 2007

– senior Sean McCarthy (.410, 45 R, 57 H) and sophomore Mike Carbo (.407, 12 DB, 27 RBI).

Senior outfielder Joe Bott (.313 BA) along with junior catcher Russell Toth (.341 BA), junior outfielder Michael Krainz (.330 BA, 32 R) and junior first baseman Adam Milanovich (.317 BA) will bring potent bats to the line-up as well.

“We have the pieces in place to put together another good season,” said Thibault. “It is not a question of desire or ability with this team. The difference has to be our ability to execute in all phases of the game. If we can do that, we will be successful.”

Marietta: The Etta Express, under the direction of fifth-year Head Coach Brian Brewer, returns nine of 15 lettermen from last year’s squad, which finished 32-17 and claimed a share of the Ohio Athletic Conference regular season title, as well as its record 20th Midwest Regional crown and a record 20th trip to the NCAA Division III World Series. The Pioneers, who won national championships in 1981, 1983, 1986 and 2006, will once again have their work cut out for them early in the season, as they look to replace many key losses and battle another tough schedule.

The strength of Marietta’s team this season should be its pitching staff, which includes every arm to take the mound for the varsity squad last year. The staff will feature a trio of All-OAC performers in juniors T.J. Knowlton and Justin Merryman and sophomore Nate Eschbaugh.

Senior All-Region and All-OAC standout Tony Piconke will lead the Pioneers’ offense in 2008. The outfielder paced the team in eight offensive categories a year ago. Senior corner infielder Dom Winters is working to close his career with another strong season.

Third baseman Cameron Cimino, middle infielder Brennan Cribbins and Merryman, when not pitching, are all primed for solid junior campaigns at the plate. Catcher Danny Jones, first baseman Mark Lakas and infielder Tyler Penwell should also be factors in the offense as sophomores in 2008.

Marietta will open its season against host Piedmont in Demorest, Georgia, on March 1. The Pioneers will also be traveling to Texas again for Spring Break (March 10-14) with a stop in Memphis, Tennessee, to take on Rhodes (March 9). Marietta’s home opener at Don Schaly Stadium is scheduled against Heidelberg on March 22.

Mount Union: In 2008, Mount Union College’s baseball team is expected to return four everyday starters and 10 letter winners overall from last year’s squad that finished seventh overall in the Ohio Athletic Conference.

The Purple Raiders (17-21/7-11 OAC in ‘07) are expected to be led by a trio of .300 hitters from a year ago – including senior/outfielder Andy Warner (North Canton/Hoover), who led the squad with a .364 mark, junior/first baseman Cory Slaybaugh (Hartville/Lake), who finished the season at .313, and senior/third baseman Nate McFarland (Canton/GlenOak), who posted a .309 mark in ‘07.

Warner, who also earned Academic Honorable-Mention All-OAC status last spring, led the Raiders in hits (44), and RBI (25), while finishing third in the conference in doubles (13) and eighth in slugging percentage (.545).

“We will need these players to once again carry much of the offensive load while some of our younger players gain experience – especially early in the season,” noted Raider Head Coach Paul Hesse (212-202-3), who enters his 12th year at the helm of the Raider program in ‘08. “We should have some very competitive battles for playing time this spring. Hopefully, we can fill in the right pieces quickly around our returning players.”

The Raiders will also need to replace their top three starters in the rotation – who were lost to graduation. Those starters accounted for over 160 innings and 33 appearances on the hill in ‘07.

“There’s no question our pitching staff will look different this year,” added Hesse. “The good news is we return our starting catcher (Jon Schulz), who does a good job of handling our staff and should help bring the pitchers along.”

Senior/catcher Jon Schulz (Chardon/Notre Dame-Cathedral Latin) is back after starting 35 of the team’s 38 games behind the plate in 2007.

Overall last spring, the Purple Raiders finished fifth in the conference in team earned run average (4.84), ninth in hitting (.276) and sixth

in fielding percentage (.953).

“We have to improve in all areas if we want to earn a spot in the conference’s four-team tournament at year’s end,” emphasized Hesse. “With the newcomers we have added and the returning players we have in our program, we believe we can be in the hunt this spring. The work ethic from our fall practices on has been positive. If we stay relatively healthy, we believe we can be a much-improved team.”

Muskingum: The Muskingum College baseball team, under the guidance of Muskingum’s all-time baseball career wins leader Head Coach Gregg Thompson, will look to establish themselves as one of the top teams in the rugged Ohio Athletic Conference in 2008.

Leading the charge will be a pair of all-conference selections from last season, sophomore catcher Brock Whiteman and sophomore second baseman Wes Carder.

Whiteman, who hit .343, led the Black & Magenta in at-bats (137), hits (47), triples (5), home runs (4), RBI (37), total bases (75) and slugging percentage (.547). Furthermore, he scored 25 runs, belted six doubles and started 37 games.

Carder led the Fish in hitting with a .422 average and was second on the team with 43 hits and two triples. He played in 33 games and logged 102 at-bats, scored 27 runs, hit four doubles, registered 18 RBI, tallied 51 total bases and notched a .500 slugging percentage.

Adding to the Muskie fire power will be senior first baseman Seth Sibert, senior catcher Brock Huntsman and junior outfielder/pitcher Levi Shaw.

Sibert hit .333 with seven doubles, three home runs and 24 RBI, while Huntsman collected 30 hits and 18 RBI. Shaw led the team in wins (4), appearances (14) and complete games (1). Shaw added 30 strikeouts in 45.1 innings of work.

The 2007 season was a record-breaking campaign for Muskingum. Thompson etched his name in the records book as the all-time career wins leader for the Muskie baseball program following the Muskies’ doubleheader sweep of Notre Dame College on March 6. Additionally, the Muskies set the school record with a 15-game winning streak, which also allowed the Black & Magenta to set the school mark for best start of a season at 15-1.

Muskingum opens the year at the Gene Cusic Collegiate Classic in Fort Myers, Florida, in early March.

Ohio Northern: The Ohio Northern baseball team took a step in the right direction in 2007 and will look to build upon that success in ‘08.

Third-year head coach Justin Bergman welcomes back a young but experienced group, including 12 letterwinners, six starters and five pitchers.

On the mound, seniors Mark Sankovich and Drew Wieland along with junior Brill Hill will carry the bulk of the load. Hill was the workhorse of the staff last season, throwing 72.2 innings and was fourth in the OAC with 59 punch-outs. Sankovich made nine starts last year and had three complete games while Wieland appeared in 12 games out of the pen and recorded 20 strikeouts.

Offensively, junior Mike Henfling and sophomores Brandon Hubbard, Brett Katana, Loren Fleischman and Jeff Henfling will look to pick up the run production after the departure of All-OAC graduated seniors Phil Bruns and Josh Conkey.

Mike Henfling led the team a season ago with 22 RBIs and batted .272. He was also third on the team with five doubles. Brother Jeff batted .282 with 24 hits and 10 RBIs in 2007.

Hubbard jumped out of the gate fast, nearly hitting for the cycle in his first collegiate game. He finished the season second on the team with a .289 batting average and was 17-of-23 in stolen base attempts.

Fleischman provided some pop last season, swatting two home runs and collecting 20 hits in 69 at-bats. Katana started all 38 games as a freshman and led the team with six outfield assists. He also batted .270 with six doubles.

At first glance, this Polar Bear squad may look young with just six upperclassmen, but with the experience gained in 2007 and the additions of a strong freshman class, Northern looks to make a push at the OAC Tournament in 2008.

Otterbein: Otterbein heads into the 2008 season with pretty much the same set of goals it has adopted over the last five seasons.

"They really haven't changed," said head coach George Powell, who begins his ninth season at the head of the Otterbein baseball program.

"We have established ourselves in the Ohio Athletic Conference (OAC) over the last five years," Powell continued, "and our goals remain the same. We want to win an OAC championship, and win in the regional—something (regional championship) we haven't been able to do yet."

The Cardinals seem well equipped to meet the challenge, returning 28 lettermen from last season's squad that finished 32-13 overall and advanced into the NCAA Division III Tournament for the third straight season by winning their third straight OAC Tournament championship. Otterbein finished regular-season play third in the OAC last season, one game out of first place at 12-6.

Otterbein enters the new season ranked 22nd in the nation by Collegiate Baseball and 20th by D3baseball.com.

Powell cites "pitching" and "experience" as the strengths of the 2008 ball club. "We have experience all over the field, and a number of four-year starters."

Two-time OAC pitcher of the year Dan Remenowsky, a senior, returns to anchor a pitching staff that threw for a combined 4.08 ERA, second best in the OAC last season. The right-hander, a three-time All-OAC performer, pitched his way to a perfect 9-0 in 2007 and led the league with 76 strikeouts while finishing second with a 2.71 ERA.

Other starters returning to the pitching staff include Doug Stevens, a two-time All-OAC pick, and Jeremy Williams. Stevens, a senior right-hander, finished 5-6 last season, compiling a 3.33 ERA while striking out 46. Williams, a junior right-hander, finished with a 5-1 record and a 3.31 ERA.

Other returning pitchers include J.J. Mathews, a senior right-hander, who made three starts in nine appearances and ended with a 3-0 record; and junior right-hander Alex Hayes, who made seven appearances and compiled a 2.25 ERA over eight innings.

Senior shortstop Ben Titus, a three-time all-conference performer, anchors the infield, which also includes returning starters Tyler Rudman, a junior second baseman, and Brandon Mauck, a senior third baseman.

Titus, who batted .364 last season, finished among the top five in the OAC in hits (63), total bases (85), total plate appearances (201) and at-bats (173). Rudman batted .327 while Mauck hit .305 a year ago.

All three outfielders, all seniors, return to the starting lineup and include left fielder Chris Kovanda, center fielder Pat Connor and right fielder Aaron Hutchison, who will, most likely, catch for the Cardinals in 2008.

Kovanda, a two-time All-OAC selection, batted .356 and knocked in 30 runs last season. He ranked among the top five in the OAC in runs scored (40), hits (64), triples (4), total bases (87) and at-bats (180). Connor, a two-time All-OAC pick, batted .346 while Hutchison, an honorable mention All-OAC selection in 2007, batted .375. Connor led the OAC with seven sacrifice flies, and led the Cardinals with six sacrifice bunts and 10 stolen bases last season.

Rounding out the list of returning starters are Dan Lassak, a junior, and Brian Hiscox, a sophomore. Both players saw time at either designated hitter or first base last season. Lassak made 13 starts and batted .292 while Hiscox, who made 10 starts, hit .381 over his 18 appearances as a freshman.

Wilmington: Wilmington College enters the 2008 baseball season with hopes of climbing the ladder in the OAC. The Quakers were 6-11 in the OAC and 17-19 overall last season. Central to the Quakers' success this year will be how quickly a youthful core of players matures.

"I've never used the 'we're real young' description, but this year I guess I'm going to use it," said Tony Haley, who is entering his ninth season as head coach at WC. "We will need to get our younger players to relax and adjust to college ball. We know the conference is going to be a tough challenge. We just need to help them prepare for that challenge."

Wilmington's offense features seniors Wade Rethmel and Jason Iles, who hit .407 and .356, respectively, in 2007. Iles was an All-OAC

Honorable Mention selection.

"Wade and Jason are solid hitters," Haley said. "Jason also is a great leader. He practices as hard as he plays, and the younger players notice that."

Pitching, Haley said, is the name of the game. Wilmington's staff will look for success through the quality over quantity approach.

"This is one of the smallest staffs we've had, but I think we have nine quality pitchers," Haley said. "It's going to boil down to who wants the ball at the end, who is going to finish. We've got to learn how to finish games."

Top prospects on the staff are senior Kenny Branscom and junior Zach Stakely."

ALL-TIME OAC PLAYERS -OF-THE-YEAR

The OAC Kent Tekulve Pitcher-of-the-Year was first presented in 1995. Prior to that, the OAC awarded only the single most outstanding player with an award -- the Jack Rafeld Award. The Jack Rafeld Award has been presented since 1978.

The OAC Pitcher-of-the-Year award is named after 1969 Marietta graduate Kent Tekulve, who spent 21 seasons playing professional baseball, including 17 seasons with the Pittsburgh Pirates. He was a key member of the Pirates' 1979 World Series championship team, setting a major league record with three saves in the Series against Baltimore. He broke Hoyt Wilhelm's record of 1,018 career relief appearances. Tekulve finished his professional career with 1,050 games played, 184 saves and a 94-90 record.

The OAC Player-of-the-Year award is named in honor of one of Mount Union's most successful coaches, Jack Rafeld. Rafeld served in various capacities from 1946-79 in MTU's physical education and athletics department. In 30 years as the baseball coach, Rafeld guided the Purple Raiders to an overall record of 304-220-3.
