The Ohio Athletic Conference, the third oldest conference in college athletics, is predated only by the Michigan Intercollegiate Athletic Association (1888) and the Big Ten (1895). The Conference is older than the World Series and even the NCAA itself and has survived two world wars, the Great Depression, the Korean War and the Vietnam Conflict. From a modest beginning of six charter members in 1902, the OAC grew to as many as 24 members in the mid-1920s.

Through the years a total of 31 colleges and universities at one time or another have been members of the OAC. Currently the Conference consists of 10 members, including Baldwin-Wallace College, Capital University, Heidelberg College, John Carroll University, Marietta College, Mount Union College, Muskingum College, Ohio Northern University, Otterbein College and Wilmington College. Wilmington became the 31st OAC member school, on July 1, 2000.

In the OAC's first year of existence, 1902, the first Conference champion was crowned — Case Tech won the football title with a 5-0-0 record. Outdoor track was added a year later and a third sport, cross country, became a Conference sport in 1914. More sports were steadily added to the OAC's repertoire throughout the years, culminating in the addition of women's sports in 1984. The Conference currently sponsors championships in 21 sports, 11 men's and 10 women's.

The enrollments at the 10 OAC institutions range from 1,200 to 4,500. All of the schools were founded in the 19th century and have long and outstanding academic reputations.

While maintaining these high academic standards, Ohio Athletic Conference athletic teams and athletes have consistently enjoyed a great deal of success on a regional and national level. The athletic competition is viewed not as an end in itself, but as an extension of the educational programs.

During the 2004-05 sports season, seven OAC schools finished in the National Collegiate Athletic Association (NCAA) "Sweet 16" of their respective sports. During the fall, Mount Union football finished in the Final Four, while the Wilmington men's soccer team ended its season in the "Sweet 16". The winter season brought the OAC a pair of "Sweet 16" appearances, the John Carroll men's basketball team and the Otterbein men's track and field squad. Otterbein paved the way in the spring sports season with a pair of "Sweet 16" stops in baseball and men's golf, and the Muskingum softball team ended its year in the "Elite Eight" for the third straight season.

Individually, the Conference was represented by 58 All-Americans, including a pair of National Champions in track and field. A total of 40 men and 18 women were named All-Americans throughout the 2004-05 year. Academically, the OAC boasted 17 CoSIDA *ESPN The Magazine* Academic All-Americans, along with a bevy of regional and national honors for our coaches. Otterbein's Chris Swanson became a National Champion in the pole vault at the 2005 NCAA Indoor Track and Field Championships, while Wilmington's Doreen Nagawa captured the National Title in the Triple Jump at the 2005 NCAA Outdoor Track and Field Championships.

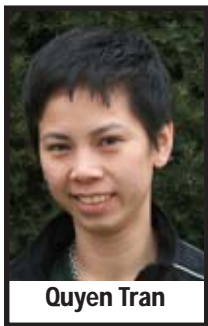

OAC Previews

Baldwin-Wallace: The Baldwin-Wallace College softball team will need to develop a pitching staff if it hopes to contend for an OAC title with a very young team in 2006. Last spring, the Yellow Jackets finished with a 17-19 overall record and a 9-9 Ohio Athletic Conference record. B-W lost seven players to graduation, including its All-OAC starting pitcher duo of K.C. Young and Jeanette Brezina.

Leading the way this spring is two-time NFCA (National Fastpitch Coaches Association) Division III All-American and three-time All-OAC catcher Nicole Loudin. Loudin led the team in three statistical categories in 2005, including batting average (.344), runs scored (26) and home runs (five). She is the B-W all-time leader in home runs in a season (11) and career (26).

Also returning in 2006 are seniors Casey Ward and Vicki Munnings. Ward saw action last season at shortstop and in the outfield. She batted .280 at the plate with 30 hits, 15 runs scored, a home run, two triples, four doubles and a team-leading 19 runs batted in. Ward also had a team-high eight stolen bases in 10 attempts. Munnings played in her first season in the Brown & Gold last year after transferring from Division II Ashland University. She made the most of her rookie season, batting .271 with 16 hits, 12 runs scored, a home run, five doubles and seven RBIs.

Other returning players include junior Molly Sersig, junior Lisa Liotta, Carrie Hoffer and senior Ellen Wolke. Sersig provided a threat at the plate batting .308 with eight RBIs.

The Yellow Jackets will be young this spring as the team welcomes nine freshmen. With senior and upperclassman leadership returning and combining along with a host of talented first-year players, B-W hopes to contend for the OAC regular season and tournament championships.

Capital: Capital looks to contend for an Ohio Athletic Conference (OAC) title with the return of 12 letterwinners (eight starters in the field and the top two pitchers) from a season ago.

Leading the way is sophomore third baseman Lindsay Shepherd who was the OAC's top hitter with a .473 batting average on her way to All-OAC and All-Region first team hon-

ors. The team's second leading hitter from a season ago also returns in junior Jackie Burris. Burris, a second team All-OAC and first team All-Region selection, started 38 games at three different positions and hit .384.

Sophomore Erin Willike and junior Jen Heidenreich return to lead the pitching staff. Willike went 15-7 and was only the second player in school history to throw over 100 strikeouts as she was a second team All-OAC pick. Heidenreich went 13-8 with 96 strikeouts and also was fourth on the team in hitting with a .324 batting average.

Capital plays an ambitious schedule in 2006 with six teams ranked in the preseason national Top-25.

Heidelberg: Heidelberg welcomes first-year Head Coach Wendy Rochon to the helm for the 2006 season. With 12 players returning along with six newcomers, the program will be geared toward intense play and teamwork.

'Berg senior captains Mollie Scott (outfield) and Jenny Coletta (infield) will bring needed experience and leadership to the 2006 squad. Sophomore Jess Thoms returns to the mound after a strong rookie season and will be joined by Coletta, Laramie Polen, Stacy Hemy and freshman Katie Allenspach. Completing the battery will be returning catcher Nikki Lagendyk and freshman Jennifer Kerman.

Joining Coletta in the infield will be returning starters Ashley Foust, Ashlie Frump and Jenny Schumm. Sophomore Heather Adams and newcomers Coree Price, Kara Roberts and Crystal Killoran will provide depth and flexibility to a very solid infield. Scott will lead an outfield that also returns Jess Monday and Rachael Everhart. They are joined by freshman Jena Quinn.

John Carroll: After coming off of three straight seasons with winning records, the John Carroll softball team looks to continue that trend in 2006.

Armed with a nucleus of seniors who have been integral to the strong performances of the past couple years, the expectations of the John Carroll program are definitely raised.

Entering this season, John Carroll will still have one of

the most consistent pitching staffs in the OAC. Kristin Platz, a senior, has been a dominating force ever since she stepped foot on the mound for the Blue Streaks. In her career, she has a record of 35-19 with a 2.08 ERA.

The pitching squad also consists of sophomores Ashley Lippert and Barbie Lewis as well as junior Betsy Rafferty.

As for the rest of the defense, John Carroll has a solid core of players. The outfield will be anchored by Janine Solomon, Jenn Nairne, and Julie Borushko. In the infield, the Blue Streaks hope that Vanessa Rodriguez, Sarah Nairne, and Jessica Kaltenbach can continue their strong performances in the past. Behind the plate, Alisha Zapor will be the most experienced backstop at Head Coach Gretchen Weitbrecht's disposal.

Sophomores Kelly D'Amato and Staci Ziobert will also battle for playing time.

John Carroll will rely on some of its veteran players to help guide the team to a strong hitting performance in 2006. In terms of average, the top two hitters from a year ago return for the Blue Streaks as both Solomon, a two-time OAC selection, and Zapor carry over eight-game hitting streaks from last season.

Sarah Nairne and Kaltenbach also return with the hopes of improving upon solid junior campaigns. Over the past three seasons, Nairne has compiled a solid .340 batting average and has 36 RBIs. Kaltenbach had a breakout year by establishing career-highs in nearly every statistical category.

Newcomers who could make an impact include the aforementioned Barbie Lewis on the pitching staff as well as power-hitting freshman Jamie Smrdel.

Marietta: The Marietta College softball team is approaching the 2006 season with a lot of excitement. It is not only looking to build upon a successful 2005, which landed the Pioneers in the Ohio Athletic Conference Tournament for the first time since 1999, but also forward to playing on its brand new field on campus, which was made possible as a result of the school's Fields Project.

The Pioneers, who finished 2005 with a record of 16-25, return a solid core from the team that finished tied for fourth in the League at 9-9 last year. Overall, Marietta returns nine letterwinners and eight starters (two pitchers and six others) from last spring.

Senior catcher Sue Schwamberger and pitcher/designated hitter Stephanie Houston, junior outfielders Lindsey Romick and Jessy Hutchison, shortstop Jenny Carroll and pitcher Kristen Quintana, as well as sophomore third baseman Nikki Veigel and second baseman Brandy Jacob all bring experience and the tools to make Head Coach Jeanne Arbuckle eager for the season to begin. When combined with a talented and hardworking freshman class, the Pioneers should once again have the personnel to make a run toward the OAC Tournament again this spring.

Mount Union: Mount Union College's softball team (30-9, 15-3 OAC in '05) opened the 2006 campaign ranked 11th in the country according to the National Fastpitch Coaches Association (NFCA) Division III preseason poll.

Last spring, the Raiders finished second in the Ohio Athletic Conference both during regular season and Tournament play, coming within one victory of tying the school mark for wins in a season (31 in 1990). The Raiders finished the 2005 season ranked 22nd in the country according to the NFCA.

This spring, the Purple Raiders return seven everyday starters and an experienced pitching staff that has obviously impressed the nation's coaches voting in the preseason poll.

Mount Union returns several players who earned All-Conference and All-Region status in 2005.

Sophomore pitcher Lindsey Royer, who set a Raider freshman record with 17 wins (17-4 record) while posting a 1.50 earned run average, earned First-Team All-OAC honors, was the OAC Pitcher and Rookie-of-the-Year and was a Second-Team All-Central Region selection in 2005.

Junior first baseman Amanda Yackmack, who led the Raiders in batting average (.376) and home runs (6) in 2005, was a Second-Team All-OAC and All-Central Region pick. She also earned 2005 Honorable-Mention Academic All-OAC status.

Three other returning players earned special recognition in 2005.

Junior catcher Crystal Thomas, who hit .354 and led the Raiders in hits (45), doubles (13) and RBIs (35), earned Second-Team All-Central Region honors last spring. Senior right fielder and pitcher Ashley Hochstetler, who missed part of the year with an injury, still managed to hit .347 and go 4-2 with a 2.50 earned run average on the mound, while earning Third-Team All-Central Region honors. Junior centerfielder Cortney Frederick, who hit .304 with a team-best 19 steals in 22 attempts, also earned Third-Team All-Central Region status.

Muskingum: Muskingum College Head Coach Donna Newberry, who became the all-time winningest coach in Division III after defeating Otterbein College (8-3) on April 27, 2005, is primed to guide the fourth-ranked Fighting Muskies to their ninth straight Ohio Athletic Conference championship and their fourth consecutive World Series.

The Muskies return three All-Americans from last year's squad that finished 42-7. Senior pitcher Erica Hoyt and juniors Kim Tackett and Amy Iammarino. Tackett plays second base and Iammarino splits time between first base and catcher.

Hoyt, a three-time All-American and two-time OAC Pitcher-of-the-Year notched a Division III best 37 wins as a junior. Hoyt's 37 victories ranked fifth best across all NCAA Divisions. She enters her final campaign with 96 career wins and 654 strikeouts. Furthermore, Hoyt's career ERA is 0.90. She is just 22 wins shy of the Division III all-time wins record, which is held by former Muskingum All-American and current pitching coach Jen Segner-Filtz.

Tackett posted career-high numbers in batting average (.410), hits (43), runs (29) and RBIs (34) in 2005. She was

honored for her excellent play throughout the season by being named OAC Hitter-of-the-Week en route to garnering First Team All-OAC accolades. Iammarino paced the team with a .463 batting average, which was second best in the League and ranked 28th in Division III. Iammarino's 63 hits led the Conference and ranked in the top-10 of the nation.

Additionally, the Muskies return eight letterwinners from last season who will provide leadership and depth, including seniors Lindsay Bramhall (outfield), Elaine Haubner (third base/outfield), Julianne Johnston (outfield/middle infield) and Jessica Rowland (outfield); junior's Ashley Carpenter (outfield), and middle infielder Allie Scheetz; and sophomores Jamie Echelberger (middle infield/third base) and Kari Hoying (catcher).

Ohio Northern: Youth will be served this season for the Ohio Northern softball program. Third-year Head Coach Annette Shepherd will have a young but talented squad suit up in 2006.

The Polar Bears welcome back nine letterwinners from last year's squad that finished 18-20 overall and were 8-10 in the Ohio Athletic Conference.

Shepherd returns one senior, one junior and seven sophomores. The incoming freshman class, which is nine women strong, will challenge for starting spots and playing time across the board, making this a very competitive preseason in the Polar Bear camp.

Leading the list of outfielders is the squad's lone senior and All-Conference returner Jessica Headings. Headings started all 38 games a year ago in left field in her first season as a starter. She is second among returners with a .283 average last year and will serve as the team leader on and off the field this spring.

Sophomore Hallie Barr started 24 games in the outfield and as designated player as a freshman a year ago and will battle for a permanent starting spot in right field this year. Lynda Thomas, in her second season, started 26 games at third base and designated player and gives ONU an anchor at the hot corner. Thomas led the Polar Bears with a .317 batting average as a freshman in 2005. Sophomore Kacey Smith also returns with 27 starts at shortstop. She hit .231 as a rookie and committed only eight errors in 27 games.

Two experienced returners are back behind the plate to take over from graduated senior Stephanie Guenther. Sophomores Jenny Plunket and Abby Majoy will vie for the starting signal-caller spot. Plunket started at third base for much of 2005 and served as the backup catcher as well, while Majoy got spot action behind the plate and as a pinch-runner.

Sophomore Erin Kenny is the only returning pitcher from last season and will inherit the ace tag. She was 5-7 with a solid 2.09 ERA in 60.1 innings pitched as a freshman.

Otterbein: With a win over perennial powerhouse Muskingum last season, eighth-year Head Coach Deb Torman believes the Otterbein women's softball team has created a solid foundation with which to build more success. Five starters and 14 letterwinners return, including All-Central Region

shortstop Beth Rowland.

Rowland, a junior, led Otterbein in hitting (.327), runs scored (19), slugging percentage (.490), on-base percentage (.381), runs-batted in (21), stolen bases (10) and was named to the Ohio Athletic Conference (OAC) First Team.

The strength of the team will be its defense and ability to play fundamentally sound softball. The Cardinals finished the 2005 season with a .936 fielding percentage, and with the return of Rowland (97 assists) and senior first baseman Sarah Baltzly (205 putouts), the team expects to be even stronger.

Junior Kristen Pawlus will take over the catching duties with the graduation of B.J. Thomas. Pawlus turned in the second-best batting average on the team at .323 and collected 15 runs, six doubles, two home runs and 19 RBIs.

Junior pitcher Megan Seibel will lead the pitching staff after finishing second on the team with a 3.69 ERA.

Joining Seibel on the pitching staff will be Toledo transfer Kaitlyn Lloyd. Torman believes Lloyd, a sophomore, will add depth and have a tremendous impact on the pitching staff. In 23.2 innings pitched as a freshman at Toledo, Lloyd was third on the staff with a 3.85 ERA including 15 strikeouts and just five walks.

Torman also expects big things from incoming freshman Janelle Jones, who she described as having tremendous power as well as being a solid defensive infielder.

Wilmington: A youth movement is under way on the Wilmington College softball team as Head Coach Quyen (Win) Tran is counting on a talented freshman class to help begin a turnaround for the Lady Quakers.

With 10 of 14 letterwinners lost, Wilmington will field a young squad this spring that will look for leadership from a junior and three sophomores.

In the circle, sophomore pitcher/outfielder Kellie Sanderson is Wilmington's lone returning starter. Sanderson turned in eight complete games in 16 starts and 86 innings pitched last season. She will share starts this spring with a promising freshmen contingent that includes Frances Spangler, Amanda Smith and Elissa Brooks.

Freshmen Kyle Arnold and Eva Stephens will be splitting time behind the plate for Wilmington this spring. Freshman Dana LaCoste is a versatile newcomer who will be able to step in behind the plate if needed.

On the infield, junior first baseman Molly Countryman will bring punch to the lineup. Last season, Countryman's .364 on-base percentage was second-best on the WC squad. Sophomore second baseman/third baseman Michele Sussi started 25 games last season and is expected to see plenty of action this spring. Newcomers to watch are freshman third baseman Elizabeth Christensen, freshman shortstop/outfielder Katie Singleton and sophomore Jessica Pollock.

In the outfield, freshman Sarah Miller will be WC's centerfielder. Sophomore Christina Cheek started 13 games last season and had the team's third-best slugging percentage. She will be among several players vying for time in the WC outfield.

All-Time Clyde Lamb Award Winners

The Clyde A. Lamb Scholar-Athlete Awards are presented annually to a single male and single female from each institution. The award winners are honored at the OAC Spring Awards Banquet with a crystal tower.

Prior to the 2004 banquet, a committee of athletic directors, senior woman administrators and faculty athletic representatives selected a male and female from the 20 student-athletes to be awarded a Clyde A. Lamb Scholarship after the banquet.

Criteria for the award includes at least two years participation in an OAC-sponsored sport, senior status, a minimum grade point average of 3.00 and sportsmanlike conduct in a manner that has brought credit to the student-athlete and his or her institution.

The award was founded in 1985 and is named in honor of Ohio Northern's Clyde A. Lamb. Lamb organized the department of health and physical education at ONU in 1929, and served as a coach, department chairman and athletics director at ONU from 1929-64. He continued to teach full-time until his death in 1969. All-time winners listed below.

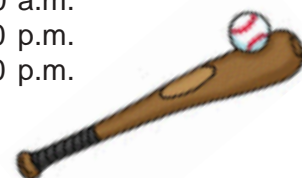
